Statement of Purpose

The mission of the Indian Mills Memorial School is to successfully educate all students through high expectations, a commitment to excellence, and equal access to comprehensive educational program, emphasizing the belief that all students will learn and become responsible, literate, thinking and contributing members of society. To accomplish these objectives, Indian Mills Memorial School will develop and maintain partnerships with parents/caregivers, patrons, and community members. A positive link between home and school will create the best learning condition for every child. Students will be given every opportunity for success through the development and enhancement of the home/school partnership.

Indian Mills Memorial School will include parents in all aspects of the Basic Skills program and in the development of the parent involvement policy. Parents, members of the community, and school staff meet to discuss the design and implementation of the Basic Skills Parent Involvement Policy. Indian Mills Memorial School reviews and updates the design and implementation of it annually.

School will:

- Provide information to parents of participating students in an understandable and uniform format.
- Provide to parents of participating children information in a timely manner about Basic Skills programs that includes a description and explanation of the school's curriculum, the forms of academic assessment used to measure children's progress, and the proficiency levels students are expected to meet.
- On the request of parents, provide opportunities for regular meetings for parents to formulate suggestions, and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions about the education of their children. The school will respond to any such suggestions as soon as practicably possible.



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- Provide to each parent an individual student report about the performance of their child on the State assessment in at least math, language arts and reading.
- Provide each parent timely notice when their child has been assigned or has been taught for four (4) or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not highly qualified within the meaning of the term in section 200.56 of the Title I Final Regulations (67 Fed. Reg. 71710, December 2, 2002).

- Keep teachers informed about events and issues that may affect your child's work or behavior.



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- Read to your child and talk with him/her or her about what you are reading.
- Limit time spent playing video games and using computer devices for social networks.
- Limit TV time and monitor the quality of viewed to ensure they are appropriate.

Staff and Parent

Parents/caregivers will be informed of school activities through various avenues of communication throughout the school year and will be consulted in the implementation of the Basic Skills program. Monthly newsletters, teacher notes, the school sign, conferences, personal contacts, phone calls and written notices will be used to establish and maintain open lines of communication with parents/caregivers. Every parent/caregiver of a Basic Skills student will receive information outlining the results of NJ-ASK testing that will specify the areas of needed instruction. The Basic Skills teachers will maintain a record of parent contacts throughout the school year updating them of their child's progress.

Evaluation

Parents will be surveyed, including input of the effectiveness of the program, and the results reviewed. The Indian Mills Memorial School will revise the Parent Involvement Policy based on the results of the annual review.
